



## PRIČA O PORODICI ŽIVOJEVIĆ (Scroll down for English)



Meho i Pemba Živojević povratnici u selo Podmašići, opština Novo Goražde. Ratne i posljeratne godine proveli su u obližnjem gradu Goraždu. Svojoj kući, u Podmašićima, vraćaju se 2003. godine. Meho i Pemba nisu zaposleni. Šestočlanu porodicu izdržavaju od jednokratne godišnje pomoći demobilisanim borcima, te dnevica koje Meho i sin Alen zarade. Regionalni stambeni program (RSP) je značajno uticao na kvalitet života ove brojne porodice. Pemba ističe da veliku zahvalnost duguje donatorima RSP-a za sve što su učinili za njenu porodicu.

Donatorima je zahvalna i kćerka Anela, koja sada ima vjeru u bolje sutra.

Anela ove godine je završila srednju tekstilnu školu u Goraždu, te se nada da će što prije uspjeti dobiti posao, kako bi pomogla porodici. Kaže da bi najviše voljela da radi u perspektivnoj goraždanskoj firmi Prevent, a vjeruje da će joj njena znanja stečena u školi biti od koristi pri zapošljavanju. Anela bi voljela da ima mašinu za šivanje, od koje bi mogla da zaradi novac kao krojačica.

Meho i Pemba imaju još i trinaestogodišnju kćer Arnelu, koja pohađa osnovnu školu, te jedanaestogodišnjeg Damira, koji pohađa 5. razred specijalne škole. U sklopu pomoći Catholic Relief Servic-a (CRS) ostvarili su pravo na dječiju zaštitu u iznosu od 100 KM. Porodica Živojević sada živi u kući, obnovljenoj u sklopu Regionalnog stambenog programa, koju dijeli sa porodicom Mehinog brata. Posjeduju oko jednog dunuma zemlje, te obrađuju baštu u kojoj uzgajaju povrće za vlastite potrebe. Meho kaže kako bi volio da ima traktor za prevoženje drva, željeza i slično. Smatra kako bi na taj način mogao ostvariti značajne prihode za njegovu porodicu. Kažu da jedni bez drugih ne bi mogli, te da je svaki član porodice aktivan u opskrbljivanju boljih uvjeta za život.

Regionalni stambeni program (RSP) ima za cilj da obezbijedi trajna rješenja za stambeno zbrinjavanje raseljenih lica nastalih nakon sukoba na teritoriji bivše Jugoslavije u periodu od 1991-1995. godine. RSP sprovode Bosna i Hercegovina, Hrvatska, Crna Gora i Srbija, a finansira najvećim dijelom međunarodna donatorska zajednica. Glavni donator je Evropska Unija. Ostali donatori su SAD, Njemačka, Italija, Norveška, Švajcarska, Danska, Turska, Luksemburg, Kipar, Rumunija, Republika Češka, Republika Slovačka i Mađarska.



## THE STORY ABOUT ZIVOJEVIC'S FAMILY

Meho and Pemba are returnees to village Podmasici, municipality Novo Gorazde. They have spent the war and post-war years in the nearby town of Gorazde. In 2003 they have returned to their home in Podmasici. Meho and Pemba are unemployed. The six-membered family is supported by one-time annual aid to demobilized soldiers and the daily allowances that Meho and son Alen sometimes earn. Regional Housing Program (RHP) had a significant impact on the quality of life of this large family. Pemba points out that she owes great gratitude to RHP donors for all they have done for her family. Her daughter Anela is also grateful to donors, who returned her faith in a better tomorrow.



This year, Anela has completed secondary textile school in Gorazde and she is hoping to get a job as soon as possible, to help her family. She says she would love to work in a prosperous company Prevent in Gorazde, and believes that her knowledge gained at school will be helpful in finding employment. Anela would love to have a sewing machine from which she could make money as a tailor.

Meho and Pemba also have a 13 years old daughter Arnela, who is attending elementary school, and 11 years old Damir, attending 5<sup>th</sup> grade in school for children with special needs. As part of the Catholic Relief Service (CRS) help program, they have obtained the right to child protection in the amount of 100 KM per month. Zivojevic's family now lives in the house, restored within the Regional Housing Program, which they share with Meho's brother family. They have around 1000 m<sup>2</sup> of land and are cultivating a garden where they grow vegetables for their own needs. Meho says he would like to have a tractor for the transport of wood, iron and similar. He believes that way he could earn significant income for his family. They say that they could not live without each other and that each member of the family is active in supplying better living conditions.
