Porodica Humić živi u idiličnom predjelu Tjentišta u podnožju planine Zelengore. Hajrudin i njegova supruga, domaćica Razija, imaju sinove Suvada i Elmira i kćerku Elviru. Elvira se udala i otišla živjeti u Maglaj, a njenih petero djece svaki slobodni trenutak koriste da borave u prirodnim ambijentu kod nane i djeda.

Sinovi Suvad i Elmir žive na Tjentištu. I jedan i drugi su nezaposleni, nisu oženjeni, a Hajrudin se žali da "cure više neće na selu da žive i da rade poslove oko bašte, kuće i stoke".

Međutim, oni su uvijek tu da pomognu roditeljima u obavljanju svakodnevnih aktivnosti.

U okviru Regionalnog stambenog programa (RSP) izgrađena im je kuća, na mjestu na kojem su prije rata živjeli. Kažu da ih najviše raduje to što je kuća uvijek puna djece. Hajrudin je u okviru pomoći održivom povratku Catholic Relief Service-a (CRS) dobio motokultivator i kosišnicu, koji mu odlično služe za svakodnevne poljoprivredne poslove. Samostalno su kupili plug i frezu, te se može reći da su sada, opremljeni za rad. Porodično se bave i stočarstvom, te imaju tri krave, desetak ovaca i kokoši. Ova vrijedna, domaćinska porodica uspijeva da zaradi za život od poljoprivredne djelatnosti. Izuzetno su zahvalni svim donatorima RSP-a koji su im uljepšali život izgradnjom nove kuće.





THE STORY ABOUT HUMIC'S FAMILY

Humic's family lives in idyllic area of Tjentiste region at the foot of the mountain Zelengora. Hajrudin and his wife, a housewife Razija, have two sons Suvad and Elmir and daughter Elvira. Elvira has married and went to live in Maglaj, while her five children use each free moment to stay in a natural environment at grandmothers' and grandfathers' house.



Sons Suvad and Elmir live in Tjentiste. They are both unemployed and are not married, to which Hajrudin is complaining that "the young girls no longer want to live in a village, nor to do the housework or care about the garden and animals". However, sons are always there to help their parents perform daily activities.

Within the Regional Housing Program (RHP) their new house was built

on the place where they used to live before the war. They say they are very happy about the fact that the house is always full of children. Within the Catholic Relief Service (CRS) help project for sustainable return Hajrudin got a moto-cultivator and lawnmower, which is of a great help for day-to-day agricultural activities. They bought the other agricultural tools independently, and now it could be claimed that they are fully equipped for work. They also have cattle breeding and have three cows, ten sheep and chickens. This hardworking family manages to earn for a living from agricultural activity. They are extremely grateful to all RHP donors who have made their life more livable by building a new home.
